

Adverbs of Frequency

Adverbs of frequency tell us how often or how frequently something happens.

Adverbs of frequency describe how often something occurs, either in definite or indefinite terms.

I always have cereal for breakfast.

I sometimes forget my mother's birthday.

I never drink coffee at night.

I travel overseas annually.

He buys a magazine weekly.



Adverbs of indefinite frequency

An adverb describing indefinite frequency doesn't specify an exact time.

They include: sometimes, often, and rarely.

I sometimes eat junk food.

I rarely read the newspaper.

I often go for a run.



Adverbs of definite frequency

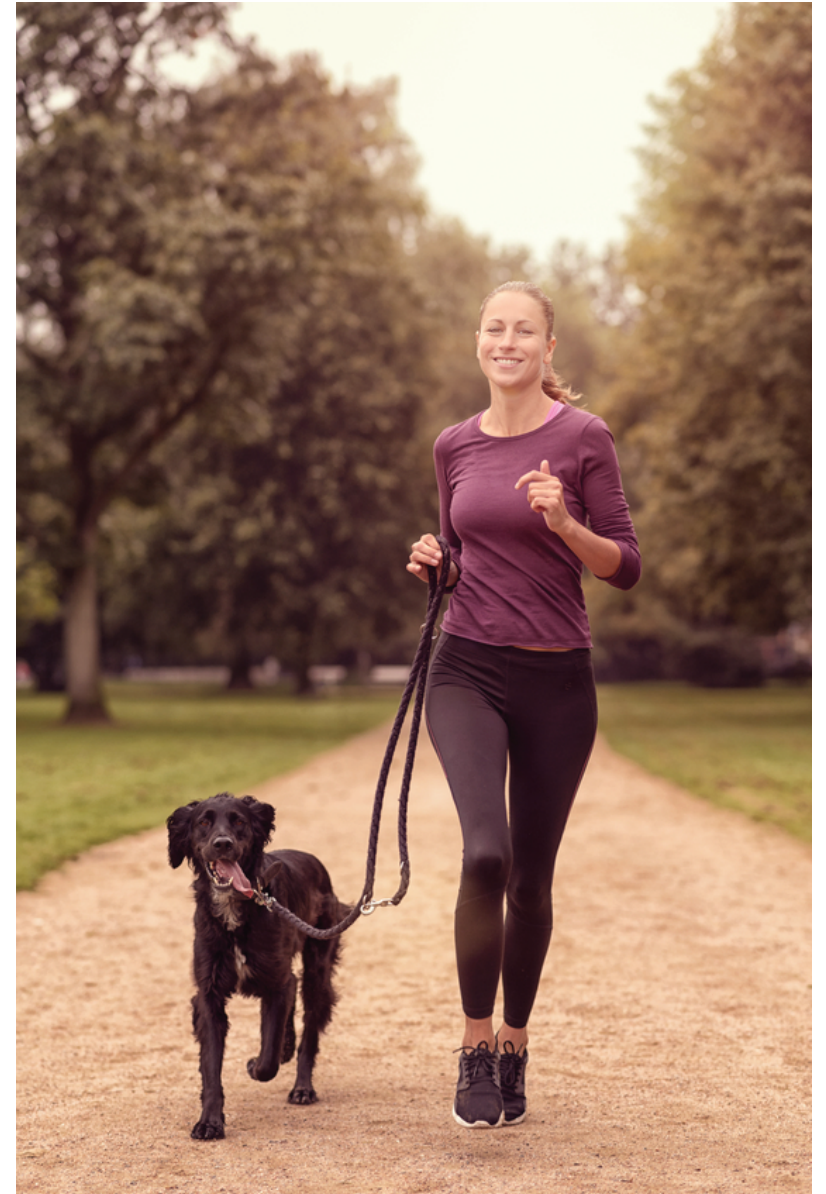
Adverbs of definite frequency describe a specific range of time for when something occurs.

They include:

hourly, daily, weekly, and yearly.

I run with my dog weekly.

I hold a raffle for charity yearly.



Word wall: Adverbs of Frequency

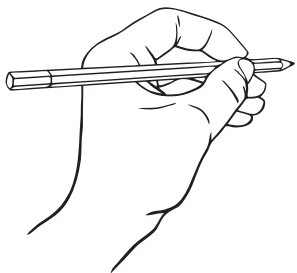
always annually constantly daily
