

Wattle Facts

- The Golden Wattle is Australia's official floral emblem.
- Most wattle flowers are yellow. Wattles usually only live 10-20 years.
- There are more than 700 species of wattle.
- Some wattles can be poisonous.
- The Golden Wattle normally flowers in late winter and spring. However, some wattles bloom all year round.
- The Australian national colours of green and gold are representative of the wattle in flower.



Indigenous Australians used wattle for food and medicines, utensils such as digging sticks, weapons (clubs, shields, boomerangs, and spears), as well as for musical instruments such as clap sticks.

Write a description of your garden, or a garden near where you live, for someone who has never seen it.








Time
