# *Ile-De-France Region: The Palace of Versailles*

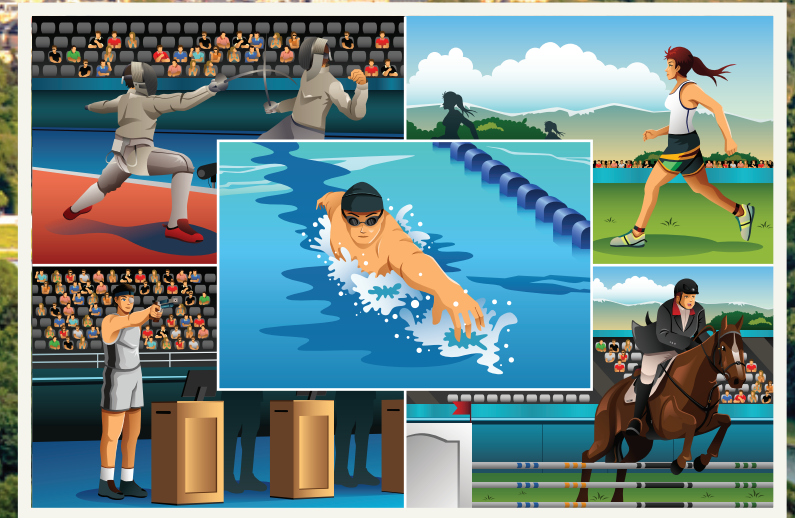
*This former royal residence is located about 19 km from Paris. The expansive gardens will be the home of two Olympic events.*

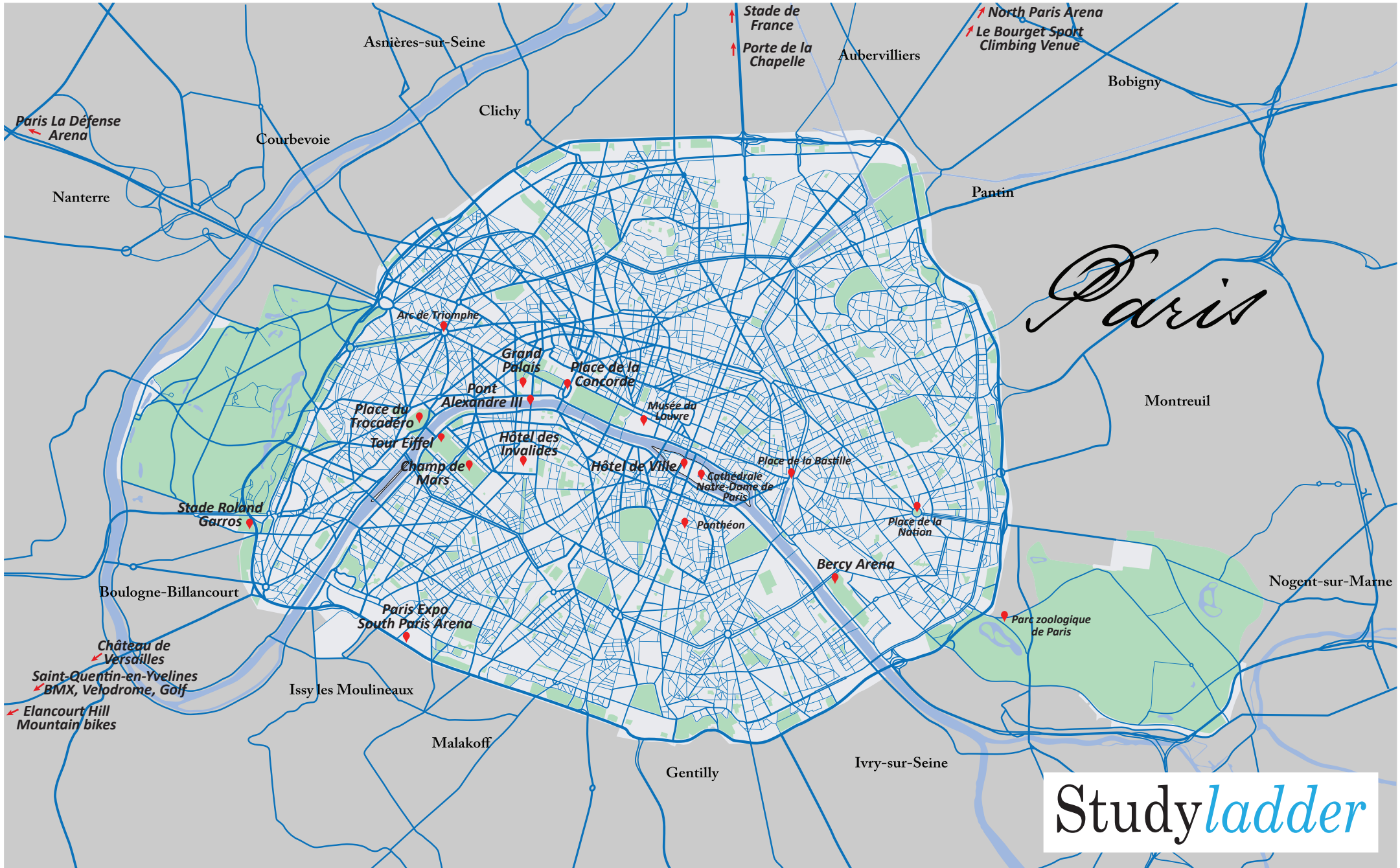

# Temporary Venues Near the Eiffel Tower

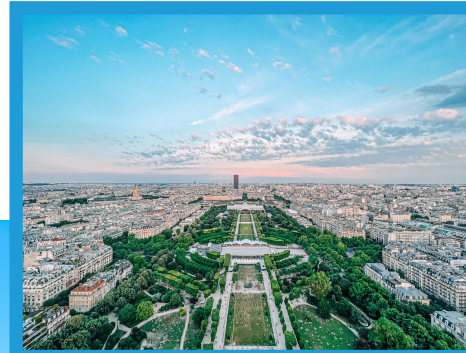
Temporary Olympic venues will be set up at various iconic landmarks throughout the city. Enclosures and coverings will remain in place for the duration of the games.

# Temporary Venues Near Other Landmarks

- The Petit (small) and Grand (big) Palais and the Pont Alexandre were built for the 1900 Exposition Universelle (Universal Exhibition).
- The Hôtel des Invalides was built between 1671 - 1676 to house and care for injured war veterans of France. The domed building houses Napoleon Bonaparte's tomb.

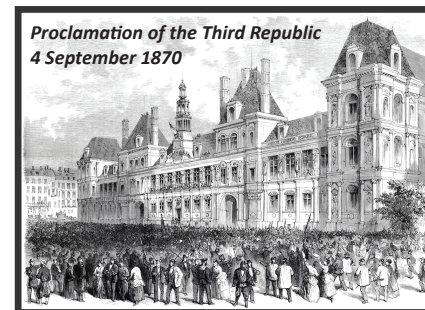

- The Hôtel de Ville is the official office of the Mayor of Paris and of local government. It is where France's Third Republic was proclaimed in 1870.
- The Place de la Concorde is the largest square in Paris. Previously known as The Place Louis XV (Louis XV Square) and then, The Place de la Revolution (Revolution Square). It was the site of the guillotine executions during the Revolution. The obelisk in the centre, brought to Paris in 1833, was a gift from Luxor, Egypt and is 3000 years old.
