It is believed that the ancient Greeks were the first to make birthday cakes. They made round or moon shaped honey cakes. A birthday cake is usually shared amongst all the people attending a birthday party. The most popular flavours for birthday cakes are chocolate, vanilla, strawberry, and cherry. Candles equal to the person's age are placed on the cake. A silent wish is usually made before blowing out the candles. In May 2005, a world record cake was made for Las Vegas' 100th birthday. The cake weighed over 58,000kgs and took over 1,000 volunteers 14 hours to assemble and decorate. In some countries they bake small objects such as coins, rings and thimbles into the cake.
