Crocodile facts

The first crocodiles appeared on earth, about 240 million years ago, around the same time as dinosaurs.



Crocodiles can stay underwater 1-2 hours.

Their heart rate can drop to 2 or 3 beats per minute to help reduce oxygen consumption.

The largest crocodile species is the saltwater crocodile. In can reach 7m in length and 1 tonne in weight.

Crocodiles sometimes swallow stones that grind the food inside their stomachs. These stones also serve as ballast.

Crocodiles do not have sweat glands. They release heat through their mouth cavities.
Crocodiles can go for several months without

food.

In ancient Egypt, crocodiles were respected and even worshipped.
