# Prefix Origins 'ive'

Adding the suffix "-ive" to a base word can create an adjective. This suffix has its origins in the Latin word "ivus" meaning "pertaining to", "tending to".

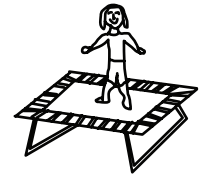
